About the role:

Under the direction of the Roads Foreman, the Automotive Tradesman is responsible for diagnosing, repairing, and maintaining a wide range of vehicles, including heavy duty

ensuring they are safe and operating efficiently.

Responsibilities:

- Will diagnose and repair the district's mixed fleet including small equipment.
- Perform routine automotive maintenance tasks, including oil changes, tire rotations, and brake inspections.
- Diagnose mechanical and electrical issues accurately using diagnostic tools and equipment.
- Will maintain the scheduling of the preventative maintenance program for the district's fleet.
- Conduct thorough vehicle inspections following all municipal, provincial, and federal regulations, acts, and laws to identify potential problems and recommend necessary repairs or maintenance.
- Maintain cleanliness and organization of automotive shop and work area.
- Assist with ordering equipment, tools, materials, and supplies.
- Ensure all files, records and necessary paperwork are kept well organized and complete.
- Adhere to all safety procedures and regulations while working on vehicles.
- Communicate effectively with other district staff and departments.
- Ensure all District Bylaws and Policies are followed.
- Assist the Director of Operations and Infrastructure in conjunction with budgets, sourcing quotes, and inform when fleet is requiring replacement.
- Any other related duties or tasks as required.

Candidate Requirements:

- REQUIRED British Columbia Class 5 Driver's License
- **REQUIRED** Grade 12 or equivalent.
- **REQUIRED** BC Trade Qualification or Red Seal Inter-Provincial Certification for Automotive Technician or Heavy-Duty Truck and Transport.
- **REQUIRED** Must work effectively with minimal supervision and as part of a team.
- **REQUIRED** Confined Space Certification or willingness to obtain.
- REQUIRED Must be able to lift heavy items employing safe lifting procedures.
- PREFERRED Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure's Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program Authorized Inspector Certification.
- PREFERRED Minimum of four (4) years of job-related experience.
- **PREFERRED** British Columbia Class 3 Driver's Licence.
- **PREFERRED** Thorough knowledge of general municipal utility infrastructure and systems.
- **PREFERRED** Knowledge of mechanical plant processes, maintenance, and repair.
- PREFERRED Must possess sufficient interpersonal skills.
- PREFERRED Must be able to communicate clearly and effectively.

Working Conditions

Work schedule will normally be Monday to Friday, eight (8) hours shifts, but will include on-call shift to be worked as required. The Automotive Tradesmen will be entitled to benefits and conditions of employment as established in the C.U.P.E Local 2979 Collective Agreement.
