

What is a RLNR Child Care Provider?

A RLNR child care provider is someone who may care for two unrelated children, in addition to their own (blood/marriage/foster), OR one sibling group, at any one time.

A RLNR has completed the quality enhancement registration process with a BC CCRR Program

Become a Registered License Not Required Child Care Provider (RLNR)

Below are the Provincial requirements to register as a RLNR with the Child Care Resource and Referral Programs in BC. Contact your local CCRR today to inquire further about becoming a registered child care provider, and to start the process!

- Be at least 19 years of age
- Complete a Self Evaluation Form
- Complete an interview with the CCRR
- Complete a Provincial Criminal Record Review Check
- Submit 2 Character References
- Complete a First Aid course
- Undergo a Health & Safety Home Assessment
- Complete 20 hours of Family Child Care Training

RLNR Child Care Providers have access to all CCRR services including child care referrals, resources, consultations, newsletters, workshops and more! In addition, families found eligible for child care subsidy with a RLNR child care provider receive a higher subsidy rate for children under 5 years of age.
